Constitution Test

The state of Illinois has clarified the Constitution mandate and determined that passing assessments over the U.S. and Illinois Constitutions *will no longer be a requirement for students to move on to high school.* There will still be summative assessments over these topics, but we will be devoting significant time in class to prepare. There is no need to stress!

<u>Absences</u>

Standards Based Grading

- Your grade in this class will be 80% based on summative assessments (tests/quizzes at the end of instruction). This will include items such as: tests, quizzes, projects, or papers.
- 20% of the grade will be based formative pieces along the way. These could be homework assignments, daily classwork, group activities, small quizzes, discussions, etc.
- Although homework (formative practice) will be given and remains extremely important, it only accounts for 20% of your overall class grade.
 - Not all formatives receive a grade
 - You will receive feedback to guide your practice
 - In PowerSchool, you will see either a grade, a green check (if it was just for completion), or an orange exclamation point (if it is missing)
 - The purpose of formative work is to practice the standard or skill being assessed.

Retake Opportunities

If you receive lower than a 4 on a summative assessment, you have the option to retake it – in fact, it is encouraged that you do so! Woo-hoo!

Generally speaking, you will be able to retake an assessment up to one week after the original being graded. Exceptions can be made, but focusing on a retake after that point will get you further behind on the current material.
